## Step Nine:

*“Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others”*

### Alone with my ex

During a coerced meeting with a bitter ex-wife, a Ninth Step emerges

I HAD been sober around six months, and one day my daughter came to a meeting. She said, “I’m going out to visit Mom. I want you to come with me.” I had not spoken to my ex-wife in over 20 years. So, I really did not know what to expect.

When we arrived at the house my ex-wife was in the yard working. When she saw me she did not speak to me. She spoke to our daughter, but the words were for me. She screamed. “I don’t want to see that man. I don’t want to hear anything he has to say. And if he doesn’t leave my property, I’ll call the police.”

I left there very angry, vowing never to return. The memory of our separation and divorce returned. She had been awarded the kids, house, car, furniture and anything else of value. I was locked up in jail, could not appeal in court and received nothing.

When I returned home I called my sponsor. He said, “Just do AA and leave the rest in God’s hands.” He reminded me that I had made a commitment when I took the Third Step. “Let Go and Let God,” he said.

My sponsor got me busy doing service work, chairing meetings, speaking and going on Twelfth Step calls with him. He was also with me as I did Steps Four through Nine.

When I’d been sober around 16 months, my youngest son called. We had talked and written to one another

while he was in school, and he had now returned how to stay. He said he wanted to see me; I said OK. We met after a meeting and he said, “We are going out to visit Mom.”

I told him what had transpired the last time I had seen his mother. I let him know that I was not going to go through that again. He replied, “It’s OK, Dad. I talked to Mom and she said it would be OK.”

I said a prayer, we left the clubhouse, and I returned to the home I once owned. I had not been inside the house for over 22 years.

Within a short period of time I found myself alone with my ex in the living room. Then something happened. Instead of an awkward silence, my mouth opened and out came Step Nine. I apologized for my past actions (never mentioning anything she had done). I asked her what I could do to atone for my past behavior.

She said, “Treat your children like a father should. And continue to do whatever it is that you’re doing.”

On the way home my son said, “Dad, I have prayed for a long time that one day you and Mom would just speak to one another. But I had given up. I knew how Mom was, and you were still drinking. However, When I saw you and Mom talking and laughing I knew it was a miracle and I was filled with a great happiness.”

Tears of joy flowed from my eyes. I realized that God had done for me what I could not have done for myself.

Today, I still remember that day. And the countless other days over the past 15 years when all I needed to do was to “Let Go and Let God” work his miracles.

### Public Information/Cooperating with The Professional Community (PI/CPC)

Volunteers needed to inform students, probation officers, doctors and others about what A.A. is and what A.A. is not. Servicing literature racks, making sure drug court has a current list of open meetings, or attending health fairs at a school or college. The Committee meetings are on the 3rd Thursday of the month at Central Office at 7:00 PM. Eric is the new Chair and can be contacted through central office.

### Bridging the Gap (BTG) — Bridging the Gap to Lasting Sobriety

Do you remember stepping out of a hospital, treatment center or correctional facility and asking yourself, "Now what?" Sobriety was new. Many of us were full of hope for the future and fearful of what it would take to stay sober. Sometimes we found AA on our own, other times AA reached out to us. Those of us who made it to the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous found a community of people who were living the solution and eager to share their experience, strength and hope for lasting sobriety. Bridging the Gap (BTG) is a world-wide service offered by AA that supports that very important first step for alcoholics who have just been released from hospitals, treatment centers or correctional facilities. We help newcomers make the transition to AA communities in their home towns. The way it works is newcomers fill out a request for assistance at a treatment facility to get to that first meeting then BTG finds a volunteer that shares the same sex, age, and zip code. Upon release, the volunteer calls the newcomer to find out what kind of help is needed to get them to that first meeting. Frequently, sponsorship blossoms from this encounter.

BTG in Santa Cruz County is making presentations at the Camp Recovery Center, Santa Cruz Residential Recovery and Rountree Detention Center (aka "The Farm"). We receive an average of twenty five requests for assistance every month. Some of those newcomers are local and need local volunteers to reach out to them. We're looking for male and female volunteers from the Watsonville and the San Lorenzo Valley areas, but please don't shy away because you don't live there! Volunteers may be contacted often or infrequently depending on the volume and demographics of the newcomers and volunteers. Interested? Contact Jon B. H & I has lots of service positions available. Ben Lomond Fire Camp is looking for males or females with two years of sobriety to be a Coordinator or secretary on Wednesdays at 7:00 PM. Si Se Puede is in need of male or female secretaries with six months of sobriety, Spanish not required, to secretary on Saturdays or Sundays at 7:00 PM.

If anyone is interested in service work at any of the jails in Santa Cruz County, they are all in need of help. You must attend an orientation, which is held the last Wednesday of each month, at 6:00 PM, at the Main Jail Facility, 259 Water Street, Santa Cruz, CA, 95060. Blaine Street Women's Jail is looking for females with two years of sobriety, with no parole or probation. Water Street Jail Men's Facility is looking for males with three years of sobriety, five years since your last felony, with no parole or probation. To serve at the Water Street Jail Women's Facility you must be female with at least three years of sobriety and no parole or probation. The Watsonville Farm is looking for a male secretary with three years of sobriety and no parole or probation.
