Please visit the **handisc.org** website for information, & to fill out the application to be able to take meetings into the jails and prisons when they re-open. Print it out, fill in and sign and bring it to the meeting to get info to become coordinators. It takes a while, so get approved ahead of time! Most of the treatment centers have re-opened meetings.

H & I also needs committee members: BSM and Intergroup Liaisons, and a literature rep, and a volunteer coordinator.

Inside Visiting Sponsorship Services.

This program has been successfully tested at San Quentin State Prison, where the response has been overwhelmingly enthusiastic. We have over 60 confined alcoholics who are currently getting the benefits of one-on-one sponsorship .Due to State Prison regulations and federal PREA requirements, regular H&I meeting volunteers CANNOT sponsor inside members at the institution they serve.

Our solution is to create an "inside visiting sponsorship service" under the auspices of the NorCal H&I Committee which operates in addition to, but separate from, our H&I meeting activities at the prisons. A special group of A.A. volunteers go into the prison as VISITORS. The clearance procedure for visitors is very simple – just a basic one-page questionnaire. Outside volunteers are matched with inside members requesting the service. After the first meeting both members are free to decide if they want to work together – like all sponsorship, it is entirely voluntary on both sides. Your anonymity is protected. Your name and address aren't revealed.

Beginning balance in the operating account: \$13,496.40 / Closed with \$11,273.74 There was something that was wonky – a deposit was prepared and taken to the bank, but it wasn't credited to the account until Jan 3rd. There were some additional expenses for the bookkeeper, but things are on par. Library Account started with \$28,955.59 / Closed \$27,434.68

\$31,688.10 is the ending balance on the reserve account. We earn \$0.27 a month of interest woohoo! **Office Manager: Mary/Grey** Grey reported that the toilet broke, had that repaired, they are purchasing a new phone. If someone calls, and they're busy, the caller gets a busy signal. We'll discuss the phone situation at Steering.

From the Writing Group

Twelve Footsteps

I have always loved Manhattan. Some people vacation in warm climates, some exotic far off ports, for me it has been the city that never sleeps since the late nineties. I went seven times on a teacher's salary, but this past Thanksgiving I went sober for the first time.

I was on a quest to learn more about Barry Leach (his name is a matter of public record now). I have started doing a one hour slide presentation about the history of that little book Living Sober. I found out that his lover, Spencer Beach, worked for the New York Public Library (the big one with the lions) and there's a folder about them in their archives. I went to Greenwich Village to interview a man in his nineties who knew Spencer. Clifford is a historical author who lives above the Magnolia Bakery. We chatted for over an hour and I took notes. Later I went to a meeting of the Greenwich Village Group. It was a newcomer meeting, but it was the only one that worked with my schedule. They had a panel of three alcoholics and the last to share on a topic opened Living Sober and read one of my favorite passages about self-pity.

The next day I got on a train and went to Stepping Stones for a tour. It was just over an hour by train. I knew that Lois Wilson and Barry had become very close after Bill died. He even took her to conventions. Barry, like Bill, was an avid writer and he helped edit and revise <u>Lois Remembers</u> (that bit of information came from the page before the table of contents). The tour was wonderful, such amazing history and knowledgeable volunteers. There were only four of us and still it was hard to get a word in edgewise, such was our enthusiasm for the history. I found little evidence of Barry, but the woman who runs the place said she has a picture of Lois and him on the property in their archives.

The last stop on the tour was Bill's writing studio called Wit's End. There are twelve large rocks for you to step on as you make your way into the room that overlooked the house and garage. The fall foliage was amazing and they let us take pictures at his enormous writing desk. I did some holiday shopping in Katonah and had a nice lunch.

I headed back to Manhattan to see friends, relations and museums. I had been to New York before and witnessed amazing things. Still, there is nothing quite like seeing the world with sober eyes. B. B.
