Inside Visiting Sponsorship Services.

This program has been successfully tested at San Quentin State Prison, where the response has been overwhelmingly enthusiastic. We have over 60 confined alcoholics who are currently getting the benefits of one-on-one sponsorship .Due to State Prison regulations and federal PREA requirements, regular H&I meeting volunteers CANNOT sponsor inside members at the institution they serve.

Our solution is to create an "inside visiting sponsorship service" under the auspices of the NorCal H&I Committee which operates in addition to, but separate from, our H&I meeting activities at the prisons. A special group of A.A. volunteers go into the prison as VISITORS. The clearance procedure for visitors is very simple – just a basic one-page questionnaire. Outside volunteers are matched with inside members requesting the service. After the first meeting both members are free to decide if they want to work together – like all sponsorship, it is entirely voluntary on both sides. Your anonymity is protected. Your name and address aren't revealed.

Chair: Magi

- 1. Need to give a report on Orientation John and Mike were new, and she'll be updating the phone list. People are going to be rotating out and rotating in, so position descriptions will be sent out. Magi will not be taking any positions.
- 2. Office Manager Search 5 people have been meeting as an Ad Hoc Committee, and please pass along to groups that we're looking for a manager. General Service has been notified also.

Vice Chair: Marianne. Absent by plan, no report

Treasurer: Clint – Spread very thin, his situation has changed and his new job is very demanding, December he's travelling and hasfamily obligations. Monthly spreadsheet has been fixed. Sept Started \$9,342.27 and the ending balance was Nov \$14,497.46. Average deposits are about \$6100. Withdrawals are averaging about \$4800.00

Library \$22,205.54 and ended with \$28, 955.59 Deposits were \$6,000 and withdrawals of about \$4,800. People pay for literature and make donations at the same time. He's working on sorting through that. He needs to look at each individual receipt.

Quarterly sales and payroll taxes were completed. Sales taxes will be filed mid-February 2022. Temp office managers have filled in a bunch.

Grey added that Quickbooks have been set up and the person doing is inexpensive.

Kimberlee added for a minimal amount of money, a lot of responsibility would be taken off of Clint's plate, and Magi noted that we could discuss it at Steering.

Office Manager: Mary/Grey Grey said that things are being handled. Mary has been doing book ordering and Grey has been doing QuickBooks. The office has been operating as expected. Mary reported the daily log and summary about activity.

65 Calls; 50 visitors; 18 purchases, 32 donations. 9 - 12 step phone calls; all volunteer positions are full.

BSM Chair: Kathy. At the November meeting `117 years of sobriety! Meeting this Saturday Sally F. Newport Beach 31 years, General Service is the host Group. This IS THE LAST Zoom meeting. Committee needs a chair 3 year sobriety commitment. Also Secretary position available.

Mid County Senior Center has rules about attending. All attendees must show proof of vaccination or a negative Covid test within 48 hours, ID must match the info. We can have food, etc, They're going to have wrist bands which can be used for future meetings. Central Office will have them available, by the end of the week hopefully. Intergroup Reps go to the office and pick up a dozen or so bands, and then the Rep will be responsible for checking. It'll help the line at the front door. Two lines – bands line and the gotta check docs line.

Speaker in January - Karen C from Oakland, 34 years.

*Rick said that we can't go forward with purchasing items and enforcing this wristband policy without a vote from Steering. Kimberlee asked if there would be a meeting and Kathy said she would discuss with Magi in private and let us know.

Magi said that we can take back to the group that the meeting will be happening in January.

Activities Chair: Grey – Marianne helped on the committee 2 years ago, and Intergroup did not have a dance, so we are not planning one. He thought Ben Lomond had a dance, so maybe they'll do another one. Other groups will also have an Alcathon.

Mary asked if Ben Lomond is having a dance and Grey is not sure, they had it last time. Krishna, the Ben Lomond Rep is present and no one brought it up at the last meeting, and their next meeting is next week, so she doesn't know either. As soon as she finds out. she'll let Magi know.

Don't think you have to stay late. Plan in advance an "important date" you have to keep.

Go to a place of worship of your choice.

Don't sit around brooding. Do some reading. Take a walk with a friend.

Don't get worked up about all those holiday temptations. Remember "one day at a time." Enjoy the true beauty of holiday love and joy.

"Having had a...." we don't need to spell out the 12th Step. Reach out your hand to a newcomer (or an old-timer).

some tools of recovery By Peg P.

Upon crawling into the sweat lodge for the first time, I felt as though I had come home, finally.

To a home I had not known I was missing, ever. but one I had definitely craved, always.

Each time I enter, I absorb every part of this experience, For future reference...

In order to enter the sweat lodge of my mind,
I need only evoke my sensory memories and recall
the vision of complete darkness broken by embers, of grandfathers glowing red.
the scent of kopal, of sage, and of dust turning to mud;
the taste of sweat, of smoke, and of steam-filled air;
the sound of drums, of song, and of voices in prayer;
the feel of rhythm, of heat, and of sweat soaked hair;
What a wonderful tool. Through recall, I create the sensation
that all is right in my world, and I bring about
a womb-like feeling of calm and of peace and of safety.

While in a recent hypnotherapy session,
I 'returned' after having 'been away' with an absolute understanding,
that for me, serenity is the color of blueberry pie filling.
What a wonderful tool. Through recall I picture that DeepBluePurpleBlack color.
I create the sensation that all is right in my world,
and I bring about a womb-like feeling of calm and of peace and of safety.

When I first entered the Fellowship, I felt the satisfaction of a life-long desire, to feel a part of, like I belonged.

I was welcomed by other women in recovery--befriended, supported, sponsored. When given the opportunity of talking with a newcomer about tools, I mention the telephone, sharing that I will often pick up the phone and call somebody when things are all right.

This way I practice reaching out for help.
I go on to explain that the phone sometimes weighs 500 pounds; however, it weighs much less if I have already practiced using it.

What a wonderful tool. Through recall I picture calling others.
I recreate the sensation that all is right in my world, and I bring about a womb-like feeling of calm and of peace and of safety.

A Powerful Current

When we start to do service, really connect to other alcoholics, selfish concerns recede and disappear as we speak with them. Whether we're truly, deeply listening to their experience and concerns, not trying to give them answers, or whether we're working with them to clean out an apartment of its bottles, sadness and shame, or coming together to plan a gathering, maybe play music with them, there sometimes comes a time when the self is gone, you are just swept up in the power of unity.

I used to work a 6-10 diverter shift every Sunday morning in another county. More than any other, those quiet, early hours put me in closest touch with the alcoholic who was (often) still suffering. Flowing across the phone, listening and responding, the current of sympathetic attention and unity swept us both up.

There but for the Grace of God go I

I saw a woman sitting on the curb today, very early, as the sun was just coming up in the cold and damp. Shopping bags with clothes poking out sat beside her as she raised her arms to make gestures at the sky. Her eyes were angry, lost in whatever story she was telling herself. I slowed the car and looked, wondering whether to pull over and offer help. I looked toward her, but she didn't even notice me.

I don't know if she was an alcoholic or an addict, maybe she was having mental or emotional troubles, but i did get that feeling that she might be one of us. What I do know is that at the height of my cocaine and alcohol use, I was frequently up all night, wandering in the streets at dawn, maybe taking pictures of reflections in puddles, or driving aimlessly in my old beater car, waiting for the liquor store to open. And I too was lost in my story of of how my life was, and I could n't see the reality of what I was doing right then, the true situation I was in, having alienated most of my friends, barely able to work, let alone set goals and work toward them to realize my dreams. I couldn't fix my car, clean my small 2 room place, or fix healthy meals.

There are so may of us, who haven't grabbed out for the help we need yet, who don't even know they can be free of the prison of a very limited mind, and the belief that alcohol and drugs are our solution. There but for the grace of a higher power, the members of AA who reached out to me and told me that things would change, if I just stayed sober one day at a time and listened, go I.


