Reflections on the gradual re opening of AA meetings in the county, and our past year

Be ready for changes every week on the website! Please have secretary submit the meeting change on the change request form located at "Meeting and Website Changes" on bottom of our website home page; the web master is informing Central office of all the meetings which are changing to inperson, or hybrid, so volunteers can tell callers.

HOW TO READ SCHEDULE: If a physical address is listed, the meeting is in person. If Zoom info is listed, the meeting is Online. If both are listed, it is either a Hybrid meeting, or concurrent, but separate meetings - one in-person and one online.

We understand that some facilities are not reopening rooms to outside groups, so it may be a little slow going. We also understand that not all meetings are re-listing in the schedule. (A few have wanted to just do a "soft opening" with members who have kept current over last year before they put it in the website.)

Personally, I have been incredibly grateful for Zoom, both because I can still go to my regular meetings, but also hit a meeting in New York City or my old home towns, see and hear friends who I haven't been able to see in person. I know nothing replaces a big hug from a member of your home group, and the meeting before or after the meeting. However, Zoom has been invaluable to most of us over the shutdown, and I aim grateful for it and hope it continues for many of the big speaker meetings, and business meetings. Mary K.

Here's Peg's reaction to having that sacred space violated from earlier in the pandemic.

Dear Zoom Bombers By Peg Pierce 8-24-2020

Zoom Bombers (and elementary school custodian and junior high school counselor you might as well read this too),

How dare you? How dare you take the sense of safety and smash it into the ground like a cigarette butt? How dare you violate our safe space, the place we go to do the work, the hard work you so clearly need to do on yourselves? How dare you take your sicknesses, mix them together, blend them into one superhideous disease, and coat the inner sanctity, our safety net, with your ugliness? Really, how dare you?

I'm not so sure I want your answer, not even sure I want to give you any attention, pretty certain I do not want to affirm your nasty-hateful-hurtful-downright-caustic behavior by even acknowledging you. Kind of like the runner across the baseball field, they are not put on camera, their name is not announced, they get no airtime or any other attention with which to feed their ego.

And yet . . .

I spoke to you then, and I speak to you now, and I even find myself considering talking about what happened today on social media. Not because I want to feed your sick craving for attention, not because I think what you did was ok, but because I want others to know how to be on guard, what to watch for, how NOT to do what I have done, but rather how to react like my co-host did, how to take action, get rid of you, get you out of our room, remove you. I froze, my brain froze, I could not think of the word 'remove' only of 'mute', which did nothing but allow you more time to display your sick imagery and make your vicious threats. I watched my mouse fly across my monitor as your pictures ricocheted from

here to there, my finger clicking frantically on mute, my panic rising to take more and more control, paralyzing me in my PTSD, the result of sexual predators from my early years. The janitor and guidance counselor I thought I could trust to keep me safe. My concern for the safety and well-being of our group, our zoom room, caused me to call out, "Shut your eyes" to which someone far more objective and sane than I in that moment, responded, "We've already seen all of this". I was so shocked, surprised, and saddened by the presence of a young woman as part of your team — a woman!

Why am I so bothered that a woman (but not a man) would be a zoom bomber. I don't know. Yet. That soul searching will come later. For now, I have to get back on the horse, back to hosting a meeting, back into zoom. I have to work on my reflexes remind myself to shut down your video, REMOVE you from the room. To be more alert from the git go, be prepared for the likes of you. What I do know is that I felt betrayed. How could a person cause such turmoil? I was so shocked when the woman in your ranks stated your purpose, to hack all of our computers.

Was it because of the fires that my guard was down? I saw you all come in. Hell, I LET you in, names I did not recognize, one right after the other, I just kept clicking 'admit' while my imagination told me you were fire-related displaced persons, or actually that you came to us because your regular meeting was a fire-related displaced meeting, and I was so glad you found us, a normally very open and welcoming group, and that we would benefit from the influx of new blood, the silver lining of whatever technical difficulties you might have had that brought you to us.

Our meeting is Inclusive by its very nature. We welcome the visitor, the newcomer, and the wayward member finally returning home to us. I am so angry — at you for violating our safe space, inflicting your agenda upon us. But I don't even know what your agenda is. Really, what is the point? Are you making a statement? Is there a method to your madness? Is there some kind of gratification you get from seeing our reactions to your actions? I really don't understand. Do I even WANT to understand your agenda? I don't think I do. I cannot begin to imagine why I might need this information. Because I cannot imagine anything positive, productive, persuasive, or profound about your actions.

So, yes, I asked you a question. How dare you? But I require no answer. I simply require that you stop. I understand that I am powerless over you — I am powerless over everything but my actions and my attitudes. So, I will educate myself on quick ways to remove someone from a meeting; I will check with others about unfamiliar names, cautiously maintaining our inclusivity, I will practice removing, I will pay very close attention to what's happening in the room so that I can take quick, appropriate, responsive action. I will not live in fear that you might enter our rooms again. No, I will stand strong, empowered, sober. I will protect the wounded child in me, and remind myself that I am a woman in recovery, I am part of a team, a community. I have resources, I can ask for help, and I can offer help when I am asked. And, I can remind myself, in the name of love and tolerance, that you are probably a wounded soul and I can pray for you, for healing, for recovery.

Chair: Magi Group Inventory discussion. Are we missing anything? Can we do better? Do we have any shortcomings? Kimberlee asked about the plan – separate meeting? Written via email or during a regular meeting? Answer – regular meeting, and individual reports would be sent in writing instead.

Now that people are returning live, we'll need to update the address list for meetings. Magi will be working on the update, we are anticipating a lot of changes.

Kathy C asked about trouble getting into a meeting, pass code not working, and there was an extra level of security requested. Magi suggested she contact the Web Chair. Mac B asked about meeting change procedure in terms of who is responsible, Intergroup or the individual group – Answer – Individual Group.

Deb D asked if a group can't pay rent to contact Intergroup to put the word out that the meeting needs support. Intergroup would not directly give money.

Vice Chair: Marianne absent by plan.

Treasurer: OPEN Bob reporting: April pretty bleak. Started \$18,687.89 had \$2619.44 donations from groups for a total of \$2726 income. Expenses were \$6,305.08. A grand total \$3199.25 in the hole. Loss of \$3,538.64 Do not be discouraged. Yearly liability insurance and employment taxes were paid, so we had abnormal expenses.

Office Manager: Bob – Things are getting busier! Has volunteers most of the time, but people are taking unexpected vacations, but time was covered somehow. The Log shows 193 calls and 78 visitors (top of his head numbers). Things are good!

Mary asked if there were any openings, and everything is currently covered. Bob is wondering if he should start moving back to Aptos Park for our meetings. Magi thought the discussion would be best for Steering Committee BSM Chair: Kathy Income \$107.00.

June 5th doors open at 6:30 Speaker Thaddious K from Union City – 8 Years and hosted by Saved by Grace.

Kenna from Pasadena with 35 years for July – still looking for host groups for July and August. Kathy will send info to Joel to help recruiting a host group.

Kathy has been discussing returning to live meeting with the committee, but until she meets with the center, she cannot commit to when we'll meet in person again.

Darcy and Jack were the winners of the 2nd game show. People have asked about repeating the game, so there is discussion for once a month.

They've been going through a transition with getting back to live meetings and filling the spots for the service positions.
